**Wood Sale** – A club fundraiser was held. The wood had been donated to the club by Jennifer. Thank you Jennifer and thank you all who participated in this fundraiser.

**Bark Carving Class** – Reminder that the class is Feb 5<sup>th</sup> and payment (\$20) can be made to Garry. There are 20 spots in the class.

**Sarnia Theater Logo** – Dennis shared the financial status of the Logo project. A plaque with the carver's names is the only outstanding item to be purchased. Wayne is prepared to donate the brass if this is a feasible option with the vendor, thereby lowering the cost.

Wayne made a motion for the club to provide a plaque (estimated to cost \$60) from All Seasons Trophies in Sarnia. This was seconded by Dennis. There was some discussion, particularly about why this expense needed to be paid for by the club. Vote results: In favour = 28. Against = 1. Motion carried.

The plaque wording was reviewed by Paul of Sarnia Theatre and he takes no exception.

Terry – hummingbird nesting. Apparently, they don't use bird houses. Also, Homemade leather strop collection for trade.


